

Newcastle Elementary Earns 2015 OSPI Washington Achievement Awards

Congratulations to Newcastle Elementary for being awarded the 2015 Washington Achievement Award as awarded by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) for Overall Excellence and English Language Arts Growth. These awards are based on the State Board of Education Revised Achievement Index. Awards are calculated using statewide assessment data from the previous three years. The index measures school performance with an emphasis on improvement and recognition. Schools were recognized in seven categories: Overall Growth, High Progress, English Language Arts Growth, Math Growth, Extended Graduation Rate, English Language Acquisition, and Achievement Gap.
