Newcastle families, make your voices heard and protect your children's future! <u>Take Action</u> and tell your legislators to stand by the State Board of Education's career- and college-ready plan for graduation requirements and say no to <u>HB 1656</u>. The state has a great <u>plan on hold</u> that already provides for flexibility, plus it embeds enrichment into basic education.

For years, Washington State PTA has been working to improve basic education and get the state to pay for the foundation kids need to pursue paths after high school. We thought we did it when we helped pass House Bill 2261 in 2009. Key to that effort was embedding the 24-credit career and college ready diploma into the program of basic education.

Fast forward four years and *this state* <u>still</u> does not pay for a basic six-period day in middle and high school. And not only are the promised 24-credit career- and college-ready graduation requirements on hold, every year legislation is introduced to knock a few classes out of the mix.

This year's effort at cuts takes aim at arts, science, world language and electives.

Everything in our economy points to the need for innovative thinkers; for a deeper understanding of science and how it touches our lives; for the need to communicate across cultures and languages. A basic education should promote this. But in the name of flexibility, HB 1656 takes enrichment off the state's plate of funding requirements and pushes it back into the camp of "extras." Maybe kids will get more science, maybe they won't. This is the wrong direction.

The State Board of Education has developed a great set of flexible graduation requirements. If kids have a particular goal in mind, they are free to swap out certain credits. And if they aren't quite sure what they want to do, then the kids graduate with a de facto well-rounded education that keeps all doors open.

Rather than discussing options that give our children less, our legislators and the governor should be drafting a plan to meet the state's legal duties to amply provide for a general and uniform system of schools. They need to pay for the program of education already adopted into law. Please, <u>TAKE ACTION</u> now. Need more information? This <u>video</u> explains the flexible nature of the requirements already in law and waiting to be funded.
