Plans for the 2014-2015 school year include:

- Achieving 100% PTSA membership and increasing parent involvement in PTSA so that we can give every child a voice.
- Hosting three (3) school-wide Family Events, kicking off with our annual Costume Carnival on October 24th and including winter and spring events.
- Supporting the Issaquah Schools Foundation [ISF] in the quest to bridge

- Crafting parent education seminars to fit the needs of our community.
- Showing our FABULOUS Newcastle Elementary staff how much we appreciate their time, talent, and tenacity by treating them to special themed lunches throughout the year and a week of appreciation in the spring.

It's Almost Time for the 4th Annual Newcastle Elementary Geography Bee!

To qualify for the school be, 4th and 5th graders will soon be participating in mini geography challenges in their individual classrooms to determine grade level finalists for our school bee (date soon to be announced). After the school bee, our school champion will have the opportunity to take a written test in an attempt to continue on to the state bee, held on March 27, 2015. State winners are invited to National Geographic headquarters May 11th - 13th to compete in the national finals for scholarships and exciting prizes. Ms. Mez's Monthly Newsletter

I will be focusing on conflict resolution at both Newcastle and Maple Hills. Conflict or disagreement is normal and often happens when children get together. However, hurtful words, gestures, or physical attacks are unacceptable ways to deal with conflict and disagreement at school. Students have been learning about Kelso's Choices and Steps to Respect as ways of appropriately resolving those difficult situations.

Kelso's Choices K-2

Our K-2 kiddos will be learning and reviewing Kelso's Choices this fall. Students learn the difference between small problems (those minor situations "they are strong enough and smart enough to solve on their own") and big problems (where they need an adults help, like when someone is being hurt) and what choices can help them re-solve those small problems.

Kelso's Choices include: Go to Another Game, Talk It Out, Walk Away, Ignore, Tell Them to Stop, Apologize, Make A Deal, Wait and Cool Off, and Share and Take Turns.

Steps to Respect 3-5

The Steps to Respect program to helps students think about, develop, and practice positive social skills. Research tells us that children who learn and use these skills are more likely to get along with others and do better in school. The Steps to Respect program is designed to teach students the following:

- How to recognize, refuse, and report bullying when it happens to them or someone else
- Friendship skills that reduce the risk of being bullied, including how to make friends, join group activities, and manage conflicts.
- Emotional skills, such as understanding the feelings of others and managing emotions
- And how to use positive values (responsibility, respect, caring for others) as a guide for behavior.

Our 3rd graders will be introduced to learning how to Recognize, Refuse, and Report Bullying, while the 4th and 5th graders will review these concepts and practice being strong Bystanders and stepping in when they observe mean behavior.
