Oral Reports from Active Committees

• ISF – All In for Kids Campaign

Beth Donahoe is a Representative from ISF -- All in for Kids Campaign. Kristen O'Malley (also present) and other Board Members from ISF are taking turns and talking to their schools. Jodie Malm is our Board member contact for Newcastle; she was not able to be present. Beth shared what ISF is, and a huge thank you so much for the support for science curriculum. The foundation is fearful is that they won't be able to make the over \$1 million in this next year. New campaign -- All in for Kids, changed the name because they are trying to get away from kids calling. The more money raised then the fewer families that will be called during campaign. ISF is hoping to increase how people can donate. Wanting to spread out the burden as currently only about 25% of the families in the district are donating. If more families donated just a few dollars then we would achieve the \$250,000 goal very easily. Calling will happen November 16, 17, and possibly 19th. If families register or donate before the 4th of Nov they will be thanked and their names will be posted in the Issaquah Press. On October 14 and 28th, families can donate online. Anyone is welcome to volunteer during the calling nights; it is a fun way to help with this initiative. High School and Middle School students would receive community service hours.

• Community Liaison - John Jensen

PTSA and Committee will communicate to the parent community to get the interest up. Cindy will try to get an inventory list for teachers, so that they will be able to put together a list of suggested reading, to be shared at/before conferences.

• Food Drive – Alison Flash

Dates of the drive are Nov 1-18. Once again it will be a Husky Cougar competition. Each Friday 5th grade volunteers will count and announce the weekly winner. Is there a place to store food at the school?, No. Kara Beal will pick up and deliver the food goods to the food bank each Friday.

Special Funding Requests

U-shaped tables (Kidney) for Literacy Support. \$3624.39 Requested for 1st -5th grade and LRC I. Teacher, Kelly Goddard, "With the literacy push from the District and teachers focused on guided reading groups, it is physically difficult for teachers to get to multiple students at the same time. These teaching aids helps teachers get to students quickly. Each table fits about 4-5 students." Money is in the budget to fill this request.

Motion: "I move to approve this special funding request for kidney tables in the amount of \$3624.29," by Rachel Handsmen. Motion seconded by Sarah Herr. Motion passed.

Funding request from Second Grade, Forces and Motion Science toy Workshop. This onsite field trip is a supplement to our motion and force study. Kristin Thomas, "Field trips are becoming so difficult, if we can bring the field trips to school this is a huge opportunity. \$250 covers his charge and the travel; parents are still responsible for the \$8 for the supplies necessary for each kids project."

Motion: "I move to approve this Forces & Motion Science Toy Workshop in the amount if \$250.00," by Christy Grabowski. Motion seconded by Alison Flash. Motion Passed.

Funding request by Kathy Keegan, requesting 4 cassette listening machines and books on tape in the amount of \$139.23. This tool will help a child focus on reading fluency. As a new second grade teacher she doesn't have the resources that other teachers currently have. Discussion lead to tabling this request until further information was collected. Kristen Thomas will get additional information from other teachers to see if this is something that other classes or the book room would be able to benefit from.

Funding request form Laura Berry, Librarian, in the amount of \$156.18. She will be attending a WLMA on October 14 in Spokane, WA. The requested funds are to pay for the substitute for the day while she is at the conference.

Motion: "I move to approve this request of \$156.18 to cover the cost of a full day substitute for our library on October 14," by Meri Hartman. Motion seconded Taneka Ogden. Motion Passed.

Budget Adjustment Overview -- Sarah Herr

Newcastle Elementary PTSA Proposed Budget Adjustments 7/1/2011 – 6/30/2012 September 2011

Income Adjustments:

- (1) Barnes & Noble/California Pizza Kitchen Fundraiser: Increase budget by \$1,500 to account for income from sales during the 3 day event.
- (2) Chess 4 Life: Decrease budget by \$10,000. No longer a PTSA sponsored program.
- (3) Mary Art: Decrease budget by \$16,000. No longer a PTSA sponsored program.
- (4) Yearbook: Increase budget by \$500. Adjust income to reflect increase in expense and increase in sales.
- (5) Popcorn: Increase budget by \$100. Anticipate sales will be similar to 2010-2011 school year.
- (6) Allstate Donation: Increase budget to reflect \$10,000 Allstate donation.
- (7) Interest Earned Income: Increase budget \$840 to account for monthly interest earned on HomeStreet Savings account.

Expense Adjustments:

- (8) Class of 2019: Reduce budget by \$52.95. Adjust to reflect correct carryover from 2010-2011. Carryover from prior year was \$1,182.69 not \$1,235.64. A \$52.95 reimbursement came in after original 2011-2012 budget was approved.
- (9) Wrapping Paper Sale: Increase budget by \$500 to cover prizes for wrapping paper sales.
- (10) Auction 2012/2013: Increase budget by \$5,000 to cover deposit to reserve location.
- (11) Barnes & Noble/California Pizza Kitchen: Increase budget by \$75 to cover copying costs.
- (12) Chess 4 Life: Decrease budget by \$10,000. No longer a PTSA sponsored program.
- (13) Mary Art: Decrease budget by \$16,000. No longer a PTSA sponsored program.
- (14) Yearbooks: Increase budget by \$100 to cover supplies.
- (15) Spirit Wear: Increase budget by \$100 for copies.
- (16) Popcorn: Increase budget by \$100 to reflect increase in supply costs.
- (17) Pay Pal: Increase budget by \$500 to reflect anticipated expense for Pay Pal processing.
- (18) ISF Science Campaign: Increase budget by \$10,000 to reflect Allstate grant donated to ISF's Science Campaign.
- (19) Administrative Supplies: Increase budget by \$200 to cover accounting software.
- (20) Leadership Education: Increase budget by \$200 to cover costs associated with mandatory training for all EC members.
- (21) Membership Appreciation: Reduce budget by \$1000. No expense incurred for note pads.
- (22) Family Game Night: Increase budget by \$100 to pay for a group activity like a giant game of Candyland.
- (23) Spring Event: Increase budget by \$500 to cover \$90 entry fee for Geography Bee and \$410 for geography support materials for classrooms.

- (24) Walkabout: Reduce budget by \$30. Now a school-sponsored program.
- (25) Teacher Allotments: Increase budget by \$400 to cover allotment for additional staff.

Motion: "I move to approve revised budget as presented tonight," by Rachel Handsmen. Motion seconded by Alison Flash. Motion passed.

Vote in new EC Members Georgia Forchuk & Rachel Handsmen as Co-VPs Programs

Motion: "I move to vote in Georgia Forchuk & Rachel Handsmen as Co-VPs Programs" by Stina Fluegge. Motion seconded by Alison Flash. Motion passed.
