Newcastle Elementary PTSA, Monthly Budget Review 7/1/2011 – 6/30/2012, YTD October 16, 2011

Income:

- 1. Class of 2019 has a net income \$478.61 (\$1,038.00 \$559.39).
- 2. Directory Sales is \$2,500 which is below budget by \$1,500.
- 3. Wrapping Paper Sale proceeds collected and deposited is \$19,341.
- 4. Business Membership is over budget by \$25.
- 5. Donated Staff Membership is over budget by \$114. Have collected enough funds to pay for all Newcastle staff.
