PTSA and Needs you! (Open Positions)

With the leadership team established for 2015-2016, we still have opportunities for family involvement in many different areas. The PTSA is an all-volunteer organization that is dedicated to providing experiences that enrich the lives of every student at Newcastle Elementary. We cannot rely on only a handful of volunteers to make everything happen throughout the school year. When we lack family members to serve in leadership roles, we will be forced to forego great programs that enrich our students' lives and educational experience. Key positions that need to be filled immediately (for transition of duties) include the following:

Website/E-Communications Chair This person works with the Communications Director and the Co-Presidents to send all electronic communications to the PTSA membership throughout the year. Website is maintained by this volunteer. This is a role that can be completed entirely from home by a person with some technological savvy. If you love to be in the loop and want to help keep others informed, this is an excellent position for you! Sangeet Kindra, currently in the position, is willing to train the incoming volunteer and would love to do so for the final Cub News and What's Happening e-blasts!

Issaquah Schools Foundation [ISF] Liaison This person receives information from the ISF for distribution among our PTSA members. This is a terrific position for family members with students at multiple schools (at Newcastle and perhaps already at Maywood, for instance), as the ISF impacts all schools in the District. Wouldn't it be great to do the work once but help multiple schools?

Reflections Chair (or Co-Chairs) Our PTSA Council District-wide offers terrific support and training for this role, which begins early in the school year. Reflections is a program sponsored by the National PTA, with the theme and regulations determined at that level. This role entails sharing information, collecting submissions from students, finding individuals to judge entries at the school level, and following up with celebrations for entries that progress to the district, regional, state, or national level. This position includes some commitment into January.

The time is now for us to tell our legislators to fulfill the constitutional mandate of fully funding basic education. Despite the increases offered by the House and Senate, it is still not enough. The current budgets proposed fall far short of the need. <u>Click here to take action today</u>!

The Supreme Court has held the State in contempt for failing to meet the mandates of the McCleary decision. Our state needs to step up to the plate and fully fund basic education like they promised and stop shifting the burden onto local property owners. Simply taking local levy funding (originally meant to supplement basic education, not PAY for basic education) and spreading it across the state does not provide the basic funding needed. The court has been clear. The State is not funding the BASICS of public education. The legislature needs to fix our unfair and insufficient revenue structure and fully fund education without cutting needed services like health and human services, early learning or higher education.
