MackinVIA Resource for All



Dear Families,

Thanks to generous support from the Issaquah Schools Foundation, all Newcastle students have access to an amazing digital resource called MackinVIA.

Access the resource at: www.mackinvia.com. You need to enter our school name. Your child's user name is their 7-digit District ID which can be found on Family Access. It begins with either 08 or 18. Your child's last name is their password. (This is the standard format for accessing all Issaquah School District accounts.) Using "My Profile" you can adjust their password and add your email to get updates.

This handy portal allows your child access to eBooks and all of our subscription databases with one user ID and one password! Your child can learn about people and places (by visiting CultureGrams and World Book Online), read eBooks (Tumblebooks), discover fun facts (BrainPop, World Almanac for Kids & Zoobooks) and even create bibliographies (Easy Bib)!

It's very user-friendly and available on many platforms. It's pretty cool!

Using the "Advanced Search" feature, you can search for eBooks by Reading Level and Fountas & Pinnell levels. Using "Groups" you can find eBooks that supplement each grade level's curriculum.

Anything you add to your favorites will be saved in your backpack and can be accessed via a Reader App when not online. All of the books are unlimited access so there is no need to check out or return them.
